Critical to providing high quality outcomes for all our students is to ensure that our educators are continually improving their skills and adapting to new ways of teaching. We are therefore launching a new set of trainings related to teaching coding to 2- to 4-year olds.

This new endeavor is part of a larger strategy to expand access to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) in the communities we serve.

Below are two sets of blocks that we use for our students \*soft large blocks for our toddlers, and large magnetic panels for our 4 year-olds. We use these various blocks in order to support the development of gross and fine motor skills of our students, that teach critical thinking and spatial thinking, and are the "building block" for our new coding initiative.

**BKS has hosted two sessions with doctors designed to educate and inform staff and parents about the Covid-19 Vaccines.**

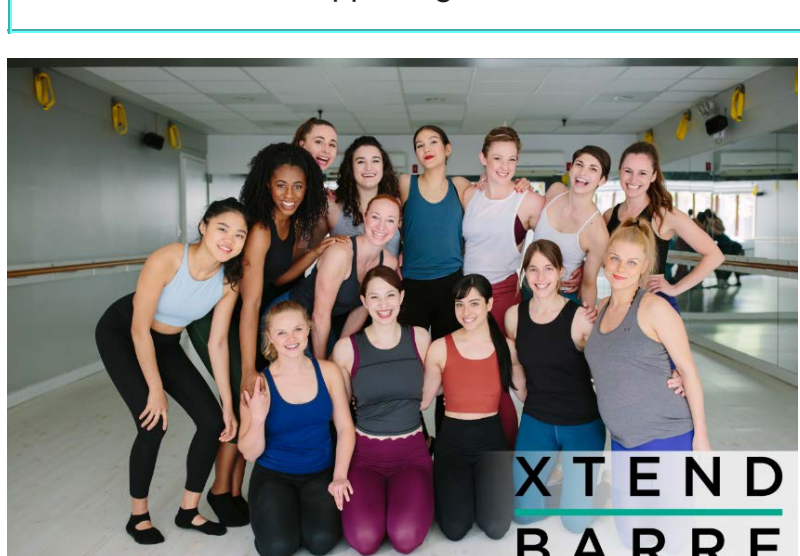
